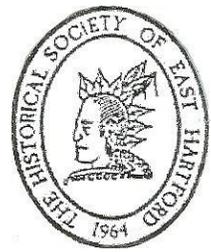

THE HSEH MUSEUM BUILDINGS AT MARTIN PARK

If 2020 was a normal year, our historical buildings at Martin Park would have been open again for eight consecutive Sunday afternoons during July and August. Because of the COVID-19 world pandemic, that did not happen. Museum donations that we rely upon for income were all but non-existent this year. However, the safety of our guests and volunteers could not be taken lightly. All members of the Historical Society should be aware that our museum can always open by appointment. If you, or any invited guests would like to visit us, just call our telephone number (860-528-0716) and we can schedule a tour.

There have been some recent developments on searching for maintenance work possibilities on our museum buildings. Paul O'Sullivan, the Grants Manager of the Town, has offered to help us on applying for some matching grants from Preservation Connecticut and / or the State Historic Preservation Office. The Schoolhouse is in bad need of repairs, requires a roof replacement and siding repair work. The Huguenot House could also use some repair work on the side boards and a new coat of paint. One of the early agreements we made with the Town is that they cover the cost of outside building maintenance while the Historical Society is responsible for inside work. With no museum donations due to this year's closing, we would have difficulty on coming up with any matching contributions if left to obtain grants on our own. Any help the Town of East Hartford could give us would be greatly appreciated.

PLAN FOR RECOGNITION AND PLAN FOR HOCKANUM SCHOOL

We are opening this discussion on the preservation of the Hockanum School to the HSEH membership. Please write down your comments, suggestions, concerns, ideas, etc. and email them back to me at farfagliabutterfly@yahoo.com or micomicona1605@yahoo.com, or call 860-528-4989. We are developing a strategy and a solid plan to be presented to the mayor.

- Obtain most recent evaluation of the structural integrity of the building from the Town structural engineer.
- Based on this report, determine what needs to be done to bring building up to code and handicapped accessible, and who can be contracted for said restoration. Volunteer craftsman from the community?
- Approximate costs for these renovations and code upgrades.
- Determine public usage for this building.
- Obtain historical information and photographs of interior and exterior of the building.
- Submit application and supportive materials to the State for designation as a state historic structure.
- Work with Town grant writer to determine how grant monies can be obtained to begin upgrades and renovations.
- Create a plan to inform community of this endeavor, and ask for donations for a fund to restore this building.
- Other suggestions, idea, recommendation, and strategies from the Hockanum Restoration Committee.
