ANNUAL MEETING PROGRAM ON PRESERVATION OF EAST HARTFORD'S OLDEST HOUSE

The Historical Society is honored to have as its guest speaker restoration specialist Steven A. Bielitz. Steve's company Glastonbury Restoration, LLC completed the roof replacement at the Huguenot House in 2019. Throughout his long career, Steve has preserved countless old early American structures from demolition mostly by disassembling, storing and finding new owners and locations. Steve's presentation will be on the 1698 John Goodwin House presently at Phelps Place in East Hartford now in the process of being disassembled. This is the oldest documented structure from 17th century Hartford that's still standing. Everything possible is being looked at to keep this architectural gem in East Hartford.
