THE HSEH MUSEUM BUILDINGS AT MARTIN PARK

Our museum buildings at Martin Park are now closed for the off season. During October we hosted two private paranormal investigations at the Huguenot House and the spirits were once again very cooperative at communicating with the researchers. The Blacksmith Shop upper floor is much more organized with the help this summer of a concerned guest volunteer who assisted us with some needed clean-up. This gentleman's name is Joe Roman and we hope to have him join us with a membership in our Historical Society. Now let's talk about the building that's most in need of repair, the Goodwin Schoolhouse. The Historical Society would love to apply for state grant money to help, but we are a non-profit organization, and the Schoolhouse is owned by the Town of East Hartford. We tried but the grant request was denied. A condition assessment was done on the Schoolhouse by the Town, so they know the cost to fully repair it. The Historical Society position is the roof needs attention now and should be addressed first.

Steven Bielitz, who was our guest speaker at the annual meeting in September, has come up with a workable solution for the roof replacement. A generous benefactor from Wethersfield has donated to the Historical Society a large supply of red cedar shake shingles that can be used for the Schoolhouse roof. The shingles have never been used and have been placed inside of the building for safe keeping. A quote for the labor portion of the roof cost will soon be given to the Town. We are offering the Town as many shingles as necessary to complete the job.
